## Sightseeing in FRANKLIN

Franklin, Indiana is 20 miles (32 km) south of Indianapolis, the capital of Indiana. Franklin was **founded** in 1823 and named after Benjamin Franklin. Many historical buildings in the city are known for their **architecture**. About 25,000 people live in Franklin.



The Johnson County **Courthouse** was **built** in 1882. It cost \$100,000 to build it, which would be about \$2,500,000 (or about 29,000万円) today. The courthouse is on the National Register of Historic Places.



The Artcraft Theatre was opened in 1922. It showed silent movies at first, but an orchestra played during the movies. Today, it shows classic movies. The Artcraft Theatre is on the Indiana Register of Historic Places.



Franklin College was founded in 1834. It was the first college in Indiana to **admit** women. The college offers more than 50 majors of study. Franklin College has about 1,000 students.
